

OVERVIEW OF PROPOSALS

We are delivering an exciting multi-million pound public realm programme on Sloane Street. The improvements include resurfacing and widening pavements and 'greening' the street.

These changes will create an elegant and welcoming environment for pedestrians, without compromising the street's character and negatively impacting traffic flows.

WE WANT TO DELIVER A SERIES OF IMPROVEMENTS THAT SECURE THE SUCCESS OF SLOANE STREET BY:

- Creating a greener street, introducing approximately 95 new trees along with elegant, ornamental planting in new planters to help absorb airborne pollutants. Along the southern section alone (see map above) there are over 50 per cent more trees being planted and 12 new planters;
- Enhancing the pedestrian experience along Sloane
 Street by widening pavements, as shown above along the southern section of Sloane Street between Cadogan Place and Sloane Terrace;
- Providing a buffer between pedestrians and traffic and create a better, more welcoming environment;


- Refreshing the fabric of the street with high quality traditional materials, including Yorkstone;
- Enhancing traffic flows for vehicles using Sloane Street and discouraging noisy, speeding cars;
- Providing residents and businesses with better
 connectivity through upgraded broadband connections;
- Making Sloane Street the number one destination in the world for luxury fashion.





PROJECT TIMELINE





INDICATIVE TIMETABLE

The public realm improvement works will be delivered in three sections, beginning at the southern end of Sloane Street at the beginning of 2020 and completing within three years.

UTILITY WORKS IN SUMMER 2019

Ahead of the main construction works beginning in the autumn, we need to carry out a series of surveys along Sloane Street to identify the location of utilities and services under the existing road and pavement. These surveys begin this summer and will include drilling exploratory holes in the pavement. This will not affect traffic or pedestrian access.

PHASE ONE

SOUTHERN SECTION

SLOANE SQUARE TO CADOGAN GATE

Works will begin later this year and will take up to two years to complete.

PHASE TWO

CENTRAL SECTION

CADOGAN GATE TO PONT STREET

PHASE THREE

NORTHERN SECTION

PONT STREET TO KNIGHTSBRIDGE

Following completion of the southern section, works are expected to begin on Phase Two in summer 2021.

GREENING THE STREET



The proposals will include extensive new planting to create an elegant green boulevard along 1km length of Sloane Street. Planting design is being overseen by multiple Chelsea Flower Show award winner, Andy Sturgeon.

Climate-proof planting

We have been looking to climate-proof the planting using drought-resistant species from Mediterranean climates around the world, such as Grevillea, Salvia and ornamental grasses.

Year-round splendour

The tree planting will be predominantly Amelanchier, which will look beautiful year-round with spring flowers, summer berries, autumn colour and a sculptural branch structure in winter.



TRAFFIC, TRANSPORT AND PARKING



Specialist transport consultants, WSP, were commissioned to carry out traffic assessments on the proposed improvements to Sloane Street.

THE KEY FINDINGS ARE:

- Comprehensive traffic modelling has confirmed that the proposed changes will not noticeably affect journey times by car or by bus;
- Traffic lanes are only removed in the central section 20 per cent of the road; and
- All major junctions will remain the same.

Junction between Sloane Street and Knightsbridge

We recognise the concern regarding this busy and complex junction. We have looked at the junctions' operation and found that the congestion is a result of lower priority being given to Sloane Street traffic compared to the other approaches (e.g. A4 Brompton Road).

It has not been possible to make the junction arrangements more beneficial without affecting the overall efficiency of the junction for all users. However, our assessment shows that narrowing the carriageway at the northern end of Sloane Street will not negatively impact the flow of traffic. After the narrowing the road would still be generously proportioned. This is illustrated in cross sections B and C, right.

Temporary closure of Basil Street

We are currently monitoring the temporary closure of Basil Street to see how Sloane Street operates as a result.

North bound traffic congestion

Our assessments show that north bound traffic will not be obstructed by south bound traffic. By insetting servicing and drop off bays into the pavement (see image A, right), this will reduce the likelihood that vehicles will obstruct the carriageway. At eight metres wide, the road will still enable vehicles to overtake a bus or other stationary vehicle (see cross section C, right).

Traffic calming and speeding cars

Traffic calming measures and increased crossing points will be introduced to reduce high speeds, and in-depth traffic modelling has ensured that vehicular flow is not impacted by the scheme.


Parking and servicing

The servicing and parking arrangements for Sloane Street will remain much the same as at present.


We are committed to ensuring the enforcement of parking is effectively managed, both officially by the Council's enforcement officers and through monitoring by Cadogan's Sloane Street 'Ambassadors' who already have a presence on the street.

Access during construction

The road will be open to traffic and access to properties will be maintained throughout the construction period.

Typical proposed carriageway width. Two cars and a bus could still pass with ease.




